## 76. Soldiers and Athletes

Endure <u>hardship</u> with us like a good <u>soldier</u> of Christ Jesus. No one serving as a soldier gets <u>involved</u> in <u>civilian affairs</u>—he wants to please his commanding <u>officer</u>. Similarly, if anyone <u>competes</u> as an <u>athlete</u>, he does not receive the <u>victor</u>'s <u>crown</u> unless he competes according to the <u>rules</u>. The hardworking farmer should be the first to receive a share of the <u>crops</u>. (2 Timothy 2:3-6 NIV)

Everyone who competes in the games goes into strict training. They do it to get a crown that will not last; but we do it to get a crown that will last forever. Therefore I do not run like a man running aimlessly; I do not fight like a man beating the air. No, I beat my body and make it a slave so that after I have preached to others, I myself will not be disqualified from the prize. (1 Corinthians 9:25-26 NIV)

Who serves as a soldier at his won expense? Who plants a <u>vineyard</u> and does not eat of its <u>grapes</u>? Who tends a flock and does not drink of the milk? Do not <u>muzzle</u> an ox while it is <u>treading</u> out the <u>grain</u>. If we have <u>sown</u> spiritual seed among you, is it too much if we reap a <u>material</u> harvest from you? In the same way, the Lord has commanded that those who preach the gospel should receive their living from the gospel.(I Corinthians 9:7, 9, 11, 14 NIV)

For <u>physical</u> training is of some value, but godliness has value for all things, <u>holding</u> promise for both the present life and the life to <u>come</u>. (1 Timothy 4:8 NIV)
