15. Fathers-In-Law

... Moses kept the flock of Jethro his father in law, the priest of Midian ... led the flock to the backside of the <u>desert</u> ... to the mountain of God ... the angel of the LORD appeared unto him in a flame of <u>fire</u> out of the <u>midst</u> of a <u>bush</u>: (Exodus 3:1 KJV)

... when the father of the damsel saw him, he rejoiced to meet him. And his father in law, the damsel's father, retained him; and he <u>abode</u> with him three days: so they did eat and drink, and <u>lodged</u> there. (Judges 19:3-4 KJV)

So Ruth went out to gather <u>grain</u> behind the <u>harvesters</u>. And as it <u>happened</u>, she found herself working in a field that belonged to Boaz, the <u>relative</u> of her father-in-law, Elimelech. (Ruth 2:3 NLT)

When the <u>messenger</u> mentioned what had happened to the Ark, Eli fell backward from his seat <u>beside</u> the gate ... <u>broke</u> his neck and died, for he was old and very fat. He had led Israel for forty years. Eli's daughter-in-law, the wife of <u>Phinehas</u> ... pregnant and near ... delivery. When she heard that the Ark of God had been <u>captured</u> and that her husband and father-in-law were dead, her labor <u>pains</u> <u>suddenly</u> began. She died in <u>childbirth</u> ... She named the child Ichabod—"Where is the glory?" (1 Samuel 4:18-20, 21 NLT)

During those fifty-two days, many letters went back and forth between <u>Tobiah</u> and the officials of Judah. For many in Judah had sworn allegiance to him because his father-in-law was Shecaniah son of <u>Arah</u> and because his son <u>Jehohanan</u> was married to the daughter of Meshullam son of Berekiah. They kept telling me what a <u>wonderful</u> man Tobiah was, and then they told him everything I said. And Tobiah sent many <u>threatening</u> letters to <u>intimidate</u> me. (Nehemiah 6:16-19 NLT)

... <u>detachment</u> of <u>soldiers</u> with its commander and the Jewish officials <u>arrested</u> Jesus ... bound him and <u>brought</u> him first to <u>Annas</u> ... the father-in-law of Caiaphas, the high priest that year ... the one who had advised the Jews that it would be good if one man died for the people. (John 18:12-14 NIV)
