

## 27. Job

There was a man in the land of Uz, whose name was Job; and that man was perfect and upright ... feared God, and eschewed evil. And there were born unto him seven sons and three daughters.

And his sons went and feasted in their houses ... called for their three sisters to eat and to drink with them ... when the days of their feasting were gone about, that Job sent and sanctified them, and rose up early in the morning, and offered burnt offerings according to the number of them all: for Job said, It may be that my sons have sinned, and cursed God in their hearts. Thus did Job continually.

And the LORD said unto Satan, Hast thou considered my servant Job, that there is none like him in the earth, a perfect and an upright man, one that feareth God, and escheweth evil?

... a day when his sons and his daughters were eating and drinking wine in their eldest brother's house ... came a messenger unto Job ... oxen were plowing ... asses feeding ... the Sabeans fell upon them ... took them away ... slain the servants with the edge of the sword ... I only am escaped alone to tell thee ... came also another ... The fire of God is fallen from heaven, and hath burned up the sheep, and the servants ... also another ... The Chaldeans made out three bands, and fell upon the camels ... another, and said, Thy sons and thy daughters were eating and drinking wine ... behold, there came a great wind from the wilderness, and smote the four corners of the house ... they are dead ... Then Job arose, and rent his mantle, and shaved his head, and ... worshipped, And said, Naked came I out of my mother's womb, and naked shall I return thither: the LORD gave, and the LORD hath taken away; blessed be the name of the LORD. In all this Job sinned not, nor charged God foolishly. (Job 1:1-2, 4-5, 8, 13-22 KJV)

And the LORD turned the captivity of Job, when he prayed for his friends: also the LORD gave Job twice as much as he had before ... So the LORD blessed the latter end of Job more than his beginning ... seven sons and three daughters. And he called the name of the first, Jemima; and the name of the second, Kezia; and the name of the third, Kerenhappuch ... no women found so fair as the daughters of Job ... After this lived Job an hundred and forty years, and saw his sons, and his sons' sons, even four generations. (Job 42:10-16 KJV)
