62. Herod the Great and Sons

After Jesus was born in Bethlehem in Judea, during the time of King <u>Herod</u>, <u>Magi</u> from the east came to Jerusalem and asked, "Where is the one who has been born king of the <u>Jews</u>? We saw his star in the east and have come to worship him."

When King Herod heard this he was <u>disturbed</u>, and all Jerusalem with him. When he had called together all the people's <u>chief</u> priests and teachers of the law, he asked them where the Christ was to be born. "In Bethlehem in Judea," they replied, "for this is what the <u>prophet</u> has written:

" 'But you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; for out of you will come a ruler who will be the <u>shepherd</u> of my people Israel."

Then Herod called the Magi <u>secretly</u> and found out from them the <u>exact</u> time the star had appeared. He sent them to Bethlehem and said, "Go and make a careful <u>search</u> for the <u>child</u>. As soon as you find him, report to me, so that I too may go and worship him."

When Herod realized that he had been <u>outwitted</u> by the Magi, he was <u>furious</u>, and he gave orders to kill all the <u>boys</u> in Bethlehem and its <u>vicinity</u> who were two years old and under, in accordance with the time he had learned from the Magi.

But when he heard that <u>Archelaus</u> was reigning in Judea in place of his father Herod, he was <u>afraid</u> to go there. Having been warned in a dream, he withdrew to the <u>district</u> of Galilee, and he went and lived in a town called Nazareth. So was fulfilled what was said through the prophets: "He will be called a Nazarene." (Matthew 2:1-8, 16, 22-23 NIV)

Now in the fifteenth year of the reign of <u>Tiberius Caesar</u>, <u>Pontius Pilate</u> being governor of Judaea, and Herod being <u>tetrarch</u> of Galilee, and his brother <u>Philip</u> tetrarch of <u>Ituraea</u> and of the region of <u>Trachonitis</u>, and <u>Lysanias</u> the tetrarch of <u>Abilene</u>. (Luke 3:1 NIV)

At that time Herod the tetrarch heard the reports about Jesus, and he said to his attendants, "This is John the <u>Baptist</u>; he has risen from the dead! That is why miraculous powers are at work in him." (Matthew 14:1 NIV)
