For John came to you to <u>show</u> you the way of righteousness, and you did not believe him, but the tax collectors and the <u>prostitutes</u> did. And even after you <u>saw</u> this, you did not <u>repent</u> and believe him. (Matthew 21:28-32 NIV)

But what think ye? A <u>certain</u> man had two sons; and he came to the first, and said, Son, go work to day in my vineyard.

He answered and said, I will not: but afterward he repented, and went.
