7. Cain, the First Murderer

Adam lay with his wife Eve, and she became pregnant and gave birth to Cain ... Now Abel kept flocks, and Cain worked the soil. In the <u>course</u> of time Cain brought some of the fruits of the soil as an offering to the LORD. But Abel brought <u>fat portions</u> from some of the <u>firstborn</u> of his <u>flock</u>.
