## 71. Philip, One of the Seven

We continued our <u>voyage</u> from Tyre and landed at Ptolemais, where we <u>greeted</u> the brothers and stayed with them for a day. Leaving the next day, we reached Caesarea and stayed at the house of Philip the <u>evangelist</u>, one of the Seven. He had four <u>unmarried</u> daughters who <u>prophesied</u>. (Act 21:7-9 NIV)

Philip went down to a city in Samaria and <u>proclaimed</u> the Christ there. When the <u>crowds</u> heard Philip and saw the <u>miraculous signs</u> he did, they all paid close attention to what he said. With <u>shrieks</u>, evil spirits came out of many, and many <u>paralytics</u> and <u>cripples</u> were <u>healed</u>. So there was great joy in that city. (Acts8:5-8 NIV)

Now an angel of the Lord said to Philip, "Go south to the road the desert <u>road</u>—that goes down from Jerusalem to <u>Gaza</u>." So he started out, and on his way he met an Ethiopian eunuch, an important <u>official</u> in charge of all the <u>treasury</u> of <u>Candace</u>, queen of the <u>Ethiopians</u>. This man had gone to Jerusalem to worship, and on his way home was sitting in his <u>chariot</u> reading the book of Isaiah the prophet. The Spirit told Philip, "Go to that chariot and stay near it."

Then Philip ran up to the chariot and heard the man reading Isaiah the prophet. "Do you understand what you are reading?" Philip asked.

"How can I," he said, "unless someone explains it to me?" So he invited Philip to come up and sit with him.

The <u>eunuch</u> was reading this passage of Scripture: "He was led like a sheep to the slaughter, and as a lamb before the <u>shearer</u> is <u>silent</u>, so he did not open his mouth. In his humiliation he was deprived of <u>justice</u>. Who can speak of his descendants? For his life was taken from the earth."

The eunuch asked Philip, "Tell me, please, who is the prophet talking about, himself or someone else?" Then Philip <u>began</u> with that very <u>passage</u> of Scripture and told him the good <u>news</u> about Jesus.

As they traveled along the road, they came to some water and the eunuch said, "Look, here is water. Why shouldn't I be baptized?" And he gave <u>orders</u> to <u>stop</u> the chariot. Then both Philip and the eunuch went down into the water and Philip baptized him. When they came up out of the water, the Spirit of the Lord suddenly took Philip away, and the eunuch did not see him again, but went on his way <u>rejoicing</u>. (Acts 8:26-39 NIV)
