Then some of the <u>traveling Jewish exorcists</u> (men who <u>adjure</u> evil spirits) also <u>undertook</u> to call the name of the Lord Jesus over those who had evil spirits, saying, I solemnly <u>implore</u> and <u>charge</u> you by the Jesus Whom Paul preaches!

Seven sons of a certain Jewish <u>chief</u> priest named <u>Sceva</u> were doing this.

But [one] evil spirit <u>retorted</u>, Jesus I know, and <u>Paul</u> I know <u>about</u>, but who are you?

Then the man in whom the evil spirit dwelt leaped upon them, mastering two of them, and was so violent against them that they dashed out of that house [in fear], stripped naked and wounded.

This became known to all who lived in <u>Ephesus</u>, both Jews and Greeks, and alarm and <u>terror</u> fell upon them all; and the name of the Lord Jesus was <u>extolled</u> and <u>magnified</u>.

Many also of those who were now believers came making full <u>confession</u> and thoroughly exposing their [former <u>deceptive</u> and evil] <u>practices</u>.

And many of those who had practiced curious, <u>magical</u> arts <u>collected</u> their books and [throwing them, book after book, on the pile] burned them in the <u>sight</u> of everybody. When they counted the <u>value</u> of them, they found it <u>amounted</u> to 50,000 pieces of silver (about \$9,300). (Acts 19:13-19 AMP)
