29. Rahab

Then Joshua son of <u>Nun secretly</u> sent two <u>spies</u> from <u>Shittim</u>. "Go, look over the land," he said, "especially <u>Jericho</u>." So they went and entered the house of a <u>prostitute</u> named <u>Rahab</u> and stayed there ... So the <u>king</u> of Jericho sent this message to Rahab: "Bring out the men ...But the woman had taken the two men and hidden them ...

Before the spies lay down for the night, she went up on the <u>roof</u> and said to them, "I know that the LORD has given this land to you and that a great fear of you has <u>fallen</u> on us, so that all who live in this <u>country</u> are melting in fear because of you. We have heard how the LORD dried up the water of the <u>Red Sea</u> for you when you came out of Egypt, and what you did to <u>Sihon</u> and <u>Og</u>, the two kings of the <u>Amorites</u> east of the Jordan, whom you completely <u>destroyed</u>. When we heard of it, our hearts melted and everyone's <u>courage failed</u> because of you, for the LORD your God is God in heaven above and on the earth below ... Give me a sure sign that you will spare the lives of my father and mother, my brothers and sisters, and all who belong to them, and that you will save us from death ..."

So she let them down by a <u>rope</u> through the <u>window</u>, for the house she lived in was part of the city <u>wall</u>. Now she had said to them, "Go to the hills so the <u>pursuers</u> will not find you. Hide yourselves there three days until they return, and then go on your way." The men said to her, "This <u>oath</u> you made us swear will not be binding on us unless, when we enter the land, you have tied this <u>scarlet</u> <u>cord</u> in the window through which you let us down, and unless you have brought your father and mother, your brothers and all your family into your house. "Agreed," she replied. "Let it be as you say." So she sent them away and they departed. And she tied the scarlet cord in the window. (Joshua 2:1-21 NIV)

And Joshua saved Rahab the <u>harlot</u> alive, and her father's household, and all that she had; and she dwelleth in Israel even unto this day; because she hid the <u>messengers</u>, which Joshua sent to spy out Jericho. (Joshua 6:27 KJV)

It was by <u>faith</u> that Rahab the prostitute did not die with all the others in her city who refused to obey God. For she had given a <u>friendly</u> welcome to the spies. (Hebrews 11:31 NLT)
