3. Bathsheba

The following <u>spring</u>, the time of year when kings go to <u>war</u>, <u>David</u> sent <u>Joab</u> and the Israelite <u>army</u> to destroy the Ammonites. In the process they laid <u>siege</u> to the city of <u>Rabbah</u>. But David stayed behind ...

Late one <u>afternoon</u> David got out of <u>bed</u> after taking a <u>nap</u> and went for a <u>stroll</u> on the <u>roof</u> of the <u>palace</u>. As he looked out over the city, he noticed a woman of <u>unusual</u> beauty taking a <u>bath</u>. He sent someone to find out who she was, and he was told, "She is <u>Bathsheba</u>, the daughter of <u>Eliam</u> and the wife of <u>Uriah</u> the <u>Hittite</u>." Then David sent for her; and when she came to the palace, he slept with her. (She had just completed the purification <u>rites</u> after having her menstrual period.) Then she returned home. Later, when Bathsheba discovered that she was pregnant, she sent a <u>message</u> to <u>inform</u> David. (2 Samuel 11:1-5 NLT)

And he wrote in the letter, saying, Set ye Uriah in the forefront of the hottest battle, and retire ye from him, that he may be smitten, and die ...

And when the wife of Uriah heard that Uriah her husband was dead, she mourned for her husband.

And when the mourning was past, David sent and fetched her to his house, and she became his wife, and <u>bare</u> him a son. But the thing that David had done <u>displeased</u> the LORD. (2 Samuel 11:15, 26-27 KJV)

Howbeit, because by this deed thou hast given great occasion to the enemies of the LORD to <u>blaspheme</u>, the child also that is born unto thee shall surely die ... And David comforted Bathsheba his wife, and went in unto her, and lay with her: and she bare a son, and he called his name Solomon: and the LORD loved him. (2 Samuel 12:14, 24 KJV)

So Bathsheba went to see the aged king in his room ... bowed low and knelt before the king. "My lord, you yourself swore to me your servant by the LORD your God: 'Solomon your son shall be king after me, and he will sit on my throne.' But now Adonijah has become king, and you, my lord the king, do not know about it ... the eyes of all Israel are on you, to learn from you who will sit on the throne of my lord the king after him.

... The king then took an <u>oath</u>: "As surely as the LORD lives, who has delivered me out of every trouble, I will surely carry out today what I swore to you by the LORD, the God of Israel: Solomon your son shall be king after me, and he will sit on my <u>throne</u> in my place." (1 King 1:15-21, 28-30 NIV)
