## 38. Vashti

Now it came to pass in the days of <u>Ahasuerus</u>, (this *is* Ahasuerus which <u>reigned</u>, from <u>India</u> even unto <u>Ethiopia</u>, *over* an hundred and seven and twenty provinces:) ... In the third year of his reign, he made a feast unto all his princes and his servants; the power of <u>Persia</u> and <u>Media</u>, the <u>nobles</u> and princes of the <u>provinces</u>, *being* before him: When he showed the riches of his glorious kingdom and the honour of his excellent majesty many days, *even* an hundred and fourscore days. And when these days were expired, the king made a feast unto all the people that were present in <u>Shushan</u> the palace, both unto great and small, seven days, in the court of the <u>garden</u> of the king's palace;

And they gave *them* drink in <u>vessels</u> of gold, (the vessels being diverse one from another,) and royal wine in abundance, according to the <u>state</u> of the king. And the drinking *was* according to the law; none did <u>compel</u>: for so the king had appointed to all the officers of his house, that they should do according to every man's pleasure. Also <u>Vashti</u> the queen made a feast for the women *in* the royal house which *belonged* to king Ahasuerus.

On the seventh day, when the heart of the king was merry with wine, he commanded Mehuman, Biztha, Harbona, Bigtha, and Abagtha, Zethar, and Carcas, the seven chamberlains that served in the presence of Ahasuerus the king, To bring Vashti the queen before the king with the crown royal, to show the people and the princes her beauty: for she *was* fair to look on.

For this deed of the queen shall come abroad unto all women, so that they shall despise their husbands in their eyes, when it shall be reported, The king Ahasuerus commanded Vashti the queen to be brought in before him, but she came not. Likewise shall the ladies of Persia and Media say this day unto all the king's princes, which have heard of the deed of the queen. Thus shall there arise too much contempt and wrath. If it please the king, let there go a royal commandment from him, and let it be written among the laws of the Persians and the Medes, that it be not altered, That Vashti come no more before king Ahasuerus; and let the king give her royal estate unto another that is better than she.

After these things, when the wrath of king Ahasuerus was <u>appeased</u>, he remembered Vashti, and what she had done, and what was <u>decreed</u> against her. Then said the king's servants that ministered unto him, Let there be fair young virgins sought for the king: And let the maiden which pleaseth the king be <u>queen</u> instead of Vashti. And the thing pleased the king; and he did so.

And he brought up Hadassah, that *is*, Esther, his uncle's daughter: for she had neither father nor mother, and the maid *was* fair and beautiful; whom <u>Mordecai</u>, when her father and mother were dead, took for his own daughter. (Esther 1:1, 3-5, 7-12, 17-19; 2:1-2, 4, 7 KJV)
