## **39. The Widow at Zarephath**

And the word of the LORD came unto him, saying, Arise, get thee to <u>Zarephath</u>, which belongeth to <u>Zidon</u>, and dwell there: behold, I have commanded a <u>widow</u> woman there to <u>sustain</u> thee.

So he <u>arose</u> and went to Zarephath. And when he came to the gate of the city, behold, the widow woman was there gathering of <u>sticks</u>: and he called to her, and said, <u>Fetch</u> me, I pray thee, a little water in a <u>vessel</u>, that I may <u>drink</u>. And as she was going to fetch it, he called to her, and said, Bring me, I pray thee, a <u>morsel</u> of <u>bread</u> in thine hand.

And she said, As the LORD thy God liveth, I have not a <u>cake</u>, but an handful of <u>meal</u> in a <u>barrel</u>, and a little <u>oil</u> in a <u>cruse</u>: and, behold, I am gathering two sticks, that I may go in and <u>dress</u> it for me and my son, that we may eat it, and <u>die</u>. And <u>Elijah</u> said unto her, Fear not; go and do as thou hast said: but make me thereof a little cake first, and bring it unto me, and after make for thee and for thy son.

For thus saith the LORD God of Israel, The barrel of meal shall not <u>waste</u>, neither shall the cruse of oil <u>fail</u>, until the day that the LORD sendeth <u>rain</u> upon the earth.

And she went and did according to the saying of Elijah: and she, and he, and her house, did eat many days ... And it came to pass after these things, that the son of the woman, the mistress of the house, fell <u>sick</u>; and his sickness was so <u>sore</u>, that there was no breath left in him.

And she said unto Elijah, What have I to do with thee, O thou man of God? art thou come unto me to call my sin to remembrance, and to <u>slay</u> my son? And he said unto her, Give me thy son. And he took him out of her <u>bosom</u>, and carried him up into a loft, where he <u>abode</u>, and laid him upon his own bed.

And he cried unto the LORD, and said, O LORD my God, hast thou also brought evil upon the widow with whom I <u>sojourn</u>, by slaying her son?

And he stretched himself upon the child <u>three</u> times, and cried unto the LORD, and said, O LORD my God, I pray thee, let this child's soul come into him again.

And the LORD heard the voice of Elijah; and the soul of the child came into him again, and he <u>revived</u>. And Elijah took the child, and brought him down out of the chamber into the house, and delivered him unto his mother: and Elijah said, See, thy son liveth.

And the woman said to Elijah, Now by this I know that thou art a man of God, and that the word of the LORD in thy mouth is truth. (I Kings 17:8-24 KJV)
