## 62. Mary, Mother of James and Joses

Then Jesus <u>uttered</u> another <u>loud</u> cry and <u>breathed</u> his last. And the <u>curtain</u> in the Temple was torn in two, from <u>top</u> to bottom. When the <u>Roman officer</u> who stood facing him saw how he had died, he exclaimed, "Truly, this was the Son of God!"

Some women were there, watching from a distance, including Mary Magdalene, Mary (the mother of James the younger and of Joseph), and Salome. They had been <u>followers</u> of Jesus and had cared for him while he was in Galilee. Then they and many other women had come with him to Jerusalem. (Mark 15:37-41 NLT)

Joseph took the body, <u>wrapped</u> it in a clean <u>linen</u> cloth, and placed it in his own new tomb that he had cut out of the <u>rock</u>. He rolled a big stone in front of the entrance to the tomb and went <u>away</u>. Mary Magdalene and the other Mary were sitting there <u>opposite</u> the tomb.

After the Sabbath, at <u>dawn</u> on the first day of the week, Mary Magdalene and the other Mary went to look at the tomb.

There was a violent <u>earthquake</u>, for an angel of the Lord came down from heaven and, going to the tomb, <u>rolled</u> back the stone and sat on it. His appearance was like <u>lightning</u>, and his clothes were <u>white</u> as snow. The guards were so afraid of him that they shook and became like dead men.

The angel said to the women, "Do not be afraid, for I know that you are looking for Jesus, who was <u>crucified</u>. He is not here; he has risen, just as he said. Come and see the place where he lay. Then go quickly and tell his disciples: 'He has <u>risen</u> from the dead and is going ahead of you into Galilee. There you will see him.' Now I have told you."

So the women <u>hurried</u> away from the tomb, <u>afraid</u> yet filled with joy, and ran to tell his disciples. Suddenly Jesus met them. "Greetings," he said. They came to him, <u>clasped</u> his feet and worshiped him. Then Jesus said to them, "Do not be afraid. Go and tell my <u>brothers</u> to go to Galilee; there they will see me." (Matthew 27:59-61; 28:1-10 NIV)

And returned from the sepulchre, and told all these things unto the eleven, and to all the rest. It was Mary Magdalene, and Joanna, and Mary *the mother* of James, and other *women that were* with them, which told these things unto the <u>apostles</u>. And their words seemed to them as idle <u>tales</u>, and they believed them not. Then arose Peter, and ran unto the sepulchre; and stooping down, he beheld the linen clothes laid by themselves, and departed, <u>wondering</u> in himself at that which was come to <u>pass</u>.
