80. Women With Jesus

Not long <u>afterward</u> Jesus began a tour of the <u>nearby cities</u> and villages to <u>announce</u> the <u>Good News</u> concerning the Kingdom of God. He took his twelve disciples with him, along with some women he had healed and from whom he had <u>cast</u> out evil spirits. Among them were Mary Magdalene, from whom he had cast out <u>seven demons</u>; <u>Joanna</u>, the wife of <u>Chuza</u>, Herod's <u>business</u> manager; <u>Susanna</u>; and many others who were <u>contributing</u> from their own <u>resources</u> to <u>support</u> Jesus and his disciples. (Luke 8:1-3 NLT)

The women who had come with Jesus from <u>Galilee</u> followed Joseph and saw the <u>tomb</u> and how his body was laid in it. Then they went home and prepared <u>spices</u> and <u>perfumes</u>. But they <u>rested</u> on the Sabbath in <u>obedience</u> to the commandment. (Luke 23:55-56 NIV)

Near the cross of Jesus stood his mother, his mother's sister, Mary the wife of Clopas, and Mary Magdalene.(John 19:25 NIV)

Some women were <u>watching</u> from a <u>distance</u>. Among them were Mary Magdalene, Mary the mother of James the younger and of Joses, and <u>Salome</u>. ¹In Galilee these women had followed him and cared for his needs. Many other women who had come up with him to Jerusalem were also there. (Mark 15:40-41 NIV)

Now upon the first day of the week, very early in the morning, they came unto the sepulchre, bringing the spices which they had prepared, and certain others with them. And they found the stone rolled away from the sepulchre. And they entered in, and found not the body of the Lord Jesus ... And they remembered his words, And returned from the sepulchre, and told all these things unto the eleven, and to all the rest. It was Mary Magdalene, and Joanna, and Mary the mother of James, and other women that were with them, which told these things unto the apostles ... And it came to pass, that, while they communed together and reasoned, Jesus himself drew near, and went with them ... And the one of them, whose name was Cleopas, answering said unto him, Art thou only a stranger in Jerusalem, and hast not known the things which are come to pass there in these days ... Then he said unto them, O fools, and slow of heart to believe all that the prophets have spoken: Ought not Christ to have suffered these things, and to enter into his glory ... And their eyes were opened, and they knew him ... (Luke 24:13, 8-10, 18, 25-26, 31 KJV)
