## 25. Elisha Prayed for Victory

## 2 Kings 6:8-23 KJV

Then the king of Syria warred against Israel, and took <u>counsel</u> with his servants, saying, In such and such a place shall be my camp.

And the man of God sent unto the king of Israel, saying, <u>Beware</u> that thou pass not such a place; for thither the Syrians are come down.

And the king of Israel sent to the place which the man of God told him and warned him of, and saved himself there, not once nor twice.

Therefore the heart of the king of Syria was sore troubled for this thing; and he called his servants, and said unto them, Will ye not shew me which of us is for the king of Israel? And one of his servants said, None, my lord, O king: but Elisha, the prophet that is in Israel, telleth the king of Israel the words that thou speakest in thy <u>bedchamber</u>. And he said, Go and <u>spy</u> where he is, that I may send and fetch him. And it was told him, saying, Behold, he is in <u>Dothan</u>. Therefore sent he thither horses, and chariots, and a great host: and they came by <u>night</u>, and compassed the city about.

And when the servant of the man of God was <u>risen early</u>, and gone <u>forth</u>, behold, an host compassed the city both with horses and chariots. And his servant said unto him, Alas, my master! how shall we do? And he answered, Fear not: for they that be with us are more than they that be with them.

And Elisha prayed ... LORD, I pray thee, open his eyes, that he may see. And the LORD opened the eyes of the young man; and he saw: and, behold, the mountain was full of <u>horses</u> and <u>chariots</u> of <u>fire round</u> about Elisha.

... Elisha prayed unto the LORD ... Smite this people, I pray thee, with blindness. And he <u>smote</u> them with <u>blindness</u> according to the word of Elisha.

And <u>Elisha</u> said ... This is not the way, neither is this the city: <u>follow</u> me, and I will bring you to the man whom ye seek. But he led them to Samaria. And it came to pass, when they were come into Samaria, that Elisha said, LORD, open the eyes of these <u>men</u>, that they may see. And the LORD opened their <u>eyes</u>, and they <u>saw</u>; and, <u>behold</u>, they were in the midst of <u>Samaria</u>.

... the king of Israel said unto Elisha ... My father, shall I smite them ...

And he <u>answered</u>, Thou shalt not smite them: wouldest thou smite those whom thou hast taken captive with thy sword and with thy bow? set bread and water before them, that they may eat and drink, and go to their master.

And he prepared great <u>provision</u> for them: and when they had <u>eaten</u> and <u>drunk</u>, he sent them away, and they went to their <u>master</u>. So the <u>bands</u> of Syria came no more into the land of Israel.
