## 53. Manasseh Sought the Lord

## 2 Chronicles 33: 1-20 KJV

<u>Manasseh</u> was twelve years old when he began to <u>reign</u>, and he reigned fifty and five years in Jerusalem: But did that which was evil in the sight of the LORD, like unto the abominations of the <u>heathen</u>, whom the LORD had cast out before the children of Israel. For he built again the high places which Hezekiah his father had broken down, and he <u>reared</u> up altars for <u>Baalim</u>, and made <u>groves</u>, and worshipped all the host of heaven, and served them.

Also he built altars in the house of the LORD ... caused his children to pass through the fire in the valley of the son of Hinnom: also he <u>observed</u> times, and <u>used</u> enchantments, and used <u>witchcraft</u>, and dealt with a familiar spirit, and with <u>wizards</u>: he <u>wrought</u> much evil in the sight of the LORD, to <u>provoke</u> him to <u>anger</u>.

And he set a <u>carved image</u>, the idol which he had made, in the house of God, of which God had said to David and to Solomon his son, In this house, and in Jerusalem, which I have chosen before all the <u>tribes</u> of Israel, will I put my name for ever ...

... LORD spake to Manasseh, and to his people: but they would not hearken.

Wherefore the LORD brought upon them the captains of the host of the king of Assyria, which took Manasseh among the <u>thorns</u>, and bound him with <u>fetters</u>, and carried him to Babylon.

And when he was in affliction, he besought the LORD his God, and <u>humbled</u> himself greatly before the God of his fathers,

And prayed unto him: and he was intreated of him, and heard his supplication, and brought him again to Jerusalem into his kingdom. Then Manasseh knew that the LORD he was God.

Now after this he built a wall without the city of David, on the west side of Gihon, in the <u>valley</u>, even to the entering in at the fish <u>gate</u>, and compassed about Ophel, and raised it up a very great <u>height</u>, and put captains of war in all the <u>fenced</u> cities of Judah. And he took away the strange gods, and the idol out of the house of the LORD, and all the altars that he had built in the <u>mount</u> of the house of the LORD ... And he repaired the altar of the LORD, and sacrificed thereon peace offerings and <u>thank offerings</u>, and commanded Judah to <u>serve</u> the LORD God of Israel.

Nevertheless the people did sacrifice still in the high places, yet unto the LORD their God only. Now the rest of the acts of Manasseh, and his prayer unto his God, and the words of the <u>seers</u> that spake to him in the name of the LORD God of Israel ... His prayer also, and how God was intreated of him, and all his sins, and his trespass, and the places wherein he built high places, and set up groves and <u>graven</u> images, before he was humbled: behold, they are written among the sayings of the seers.

So Manasseh slept with his fathers, and they buried him in his own house: and Amon his son reigned in his <u>stead</u>.
