56. Moses Prayed for Pharaoh

Exodus 8: 8-15, 30-32, 9:33-35, 10:18-20 NIV

Pharaoh <u>summoned</u> Moses and Aaron and said, "Pray to the LORD to take the <u>frogs</u> away from me and my people, and I will let your people go to offer sacrifices to the LORD."

Moses said to Pharaoh, "I <u>leave</u> to you the honor of <u>setting</u> the <u>time</u> for me to pray for you and your <u>officials</u> and your people that you and your <u>houses</u> may be rid of the frogs, <u>except</u> for those that <u>remain</u> in the <u>Nile</u>."
