24. Job Was Blessed by the Lord

Job 42:1-17 KJV

Then <u>Job</u> answered the LORD, and said, I know that thou canst do every thing, and that no thought can be <u>withholden</u> from thee.

Who is he that hideth counsel without knowledge? therefore have I uttered that I <u>understood</u> not; things too wonderful for me, which I knew not.

Hear, I beseech thee, and I will speak: I will demand of thee, and declare thou unto me. I have heard of thee by the <u>hearing</u> of the ear: but now mine eye seeth thee. Wherefore I <u>abhor</u> myself, and repent in <u>dust</u> and <u>ashes</u>.

And it was so, that after the LORD had spoken these words unto Job, the LORD said to Eliphaz the Temanite, My <u>wrath</u> is <u>kindled</u> against thee, and against thy two friends: for ye have not spoken of me the thing that is right, as my servant Job hath. Therefore take unto you now seven <u>bullocks</u> and seven rams, and go to my servant Job, and offer up for yourselves a <u>burnt</u> offering; and my servant Job shall pray for you: for him will I <u>accept</u>: lest I deal with you after your folly, in that ye have not spoken of me the thing which is right, like my servant Job.

So Eliphaz the Temanite and Bildad the Shuhite and Zophar the Naamathite went, and did according as the LORD commanded them: the LORD also accepted Job.

And the LORD turned the <u>captivity</u> of Job, when he prayed for his friends: also the LORD gave Job <u>twice</u> as much as he had before.

Then came there unto him all his brethren, and all his <u>sisters</u>, and all they that had been of his <u>acquaintance</u> before, and did eat bread with him in his house: and they <u>bemoaned</u> him, and <u>comforted</u> him over all the evil that the LORD had brought upon him: <u>every</u> man also gave him a <u>piece</u> of <u>money</u>, and every one an <u>earring</u> of <u>gold</u>.

So the LORD blessed the latter end of Job more than his beginning: for he had fourteen thousand <u>sheep</u>, and six thousand <u>camels</u>, and a thousand yoke of <u>oxen</u>, and a thousand she <u>asses</u>.

He had also seven sons and three daughters. And he called the name of the first, <u>Jemima</u>; and the name of the second, <u>Kezia</u>; and the name of the third, Kerenhappuch. And in all the land were no women found so fair as the daughters of Job: and their father gave them inheritance among their brethren.

After this lived Job an hundred and forty years, and saw his sons, and his sons' sons, even four generations.

So Job died, being old and <u>full</u> of days.
