## 45. It Is Finished

## John 19:25-42 KJV

Now there stood by the <u>cross</u> of Jesus his mother, and his mother's sister, Mary the wife of Cleophas, and Mary Magdalene.

When Jesus therefore saw his mother, and the disciple standing by, whom he loved, he saith unto his mother, Woman, behold thy son!

Then saith he to the disciple, Behold thy mother! And from that <u>hour</u> that disciple took her unto his own <u>home</u>. After this, Jesus knowing that all things were now accomplished, that the <u>scripture</u> might be <u>fulfilled</u>, saith, I <u>thirst</u>.

Now there was set a <u>vessel</u> full of <u>vinegar</u>: and they filled a <u>spunge</u> with vinegar, and put it upon <u>hyssop</u>, and put it to his mouth.

When Jesus therefore had received the vinegar, he said, It is finished: and he <u>bowed</u> his head, and gave up the ghost.

The Jews therefore, because it was the preparation, that the <u>bodies</u> should not remain upon the cross on the <u>sabbath</u> day, (for that sabbath day was an high day,) besought <u>Pilate</u> that their legs might be broken, and that they might be taken away.

Then came the soldiers, and brake the legs of the first, and of the other which was crucified with him. But when they came to Jesus, and saw that he was dead already, they <u>brake</u> not his <u>legs</u>: But one of the soldiers with a <u>spear</u> pierced his side, and <u>forthwith</u> came there out blood and water.

And he that saw it bare record, and his record is true: and he knoweth that he saith true, that ye might believe. For these things were done, that the scripture should be fulfilled, A bone of him shall not be broken. And again another scripture saith, They shall look on him whom they pierced.

And after this Joseph of Arimathaea, being a disciple of Jesus, but secretly for fear of the Jews, besought Pilate that he might take away the body of Jesus: and Pilate gave him leave ...

And there came also <u>Nicodemus</u>, which at the first came to Jesus by night, and brought a <u>mixture</u> of <u>myrrh</u> and <u>aloes</u>, about an hundred <u>pound weight</u>. Then took they the body of Jesus, and <u>wound</u> it in linen clothes with the <u>spices</u>, as the manner of the Jews is to <u>bury</u>.

Now in the place where he was <u>crucified</u> there was a <u>garden</u>; and in the garden a new <u>sepulchre</u>, wherein was never man yet laid.

There laid they Jesus therefore because of the Jews' preparation day; for the sepulchre was nigh at hand.
