## 67. God's Diet Is Best

## **Daniel 1:1-16 NIV**

In the third year of the reign of Jehoiakim king of Judah, Nebuchadnezzar king of Babylon came to Jerusalem and <u>besieged</u> it. And the Lord delivered Jehoiakim king of <u>Judah</u> into his hand, along with some of the articles from the temple of God. These he <u>carried</u> off to the temple of his god in <u>Babylonia</u> and put in the <u>treasure</u> house of his god.

Then the king ordered Ashpenaz, chief of his court <u>officials</u>, to bring in some of the Israelites from the royal family and the nobility- young men without any <u>physical defect</u>, <u>handsome</u>, showing <u>aptitude</u> for every kind of learning, well <u>informed</u>, <u>quick</u> to understand, and qualified to serve in the king's palace. He was to teach them the language and <u>literature</u> of the Babylonians. The king assigned them a <u>daily</u> amount of food and wine from the king's <u>table</u>. They were to be trained for three years, and after that they were to enter the king's service.

Among these were some from Judah: Daniel, Hananiah, Mishael and Azariah. The chief official gave them new names: to Daniel, the name Belteshazzar; to Hananiah, Shadrach; to Mishael, Meshach; and to Azariah, Abednego.

But Daniel resolved not to <u>defile</u> himself with the <u>royal</u> food and wine, and he asked the chief official for permission not to defile himself this way. Now God had caused the official to <u>show</u> favor and sympathy to Daniel, but the official told Daniel, "I am afraid of my lord the king, who has assigned your food and <u>drink</u>. Why should he see you looking <u>worse</u> than the other young men your age? The king would then have my head because of you."

Daniel then said to the guard whom the chief official had appointed over Daniel, Hananiah, Mishael and Azariah, "Please test your servants for <u>ten</u> days: Give us nothing but <u>vegetables</u> to eat and water to drink. Then compare our appearance with that of the young men who eat the royal food, and <u>treat</u> your servants in <u>accordance</u> with what you see." So he agreed to this and tested them for ten days.

At the <u>end</u> of the ten days they looked <u>healthier</u> and <u>better nourished</u> than any of the young men who ate the royal food. So the guard took <u>away</u> their choice food and the wine they were to drink and gave them vegetables instead.
