1 Samuel 18:1-4, 19:1-5, 20:27-35 KJV

... when he had made an end of <u>speaking</u> unto Saul, that the soul of Jonathan was knit with the soul of David, and Jonathan <u>loved</u> him as his own soul. And Saul took him that day, and would let him go no more <u>home</u> to his father's house. Then <u>Jonathan</u> and <u>David</u> made a <u>covenant</u>, because he loved him as his own soul. And Jonathan stripped himself of the <u>robe</u> that was upon him, and gave it to David, and his <u>garments</u>, even to his <u>sword</u>, and to his <u>bow</u>, and to his <u>girdle</u>.

And I will go out and stand <u>beside</u> my ... and I will <u>commune</u> with my father of thee; and what I see, that I will tell thee. And Jonathan spake good of David unto Saul his father, and said unto him, Let not the king sin against his servant, against David; because he hath not sinned against thee, and because his works have been to theeward very good: For he did put his life in his hand, and slew the Philistine, and the LORD wrought a great salvation for all Israel: thou sawest it, and didst rejoice: wherefore then wilt thou sin against <u>innocent</u> blood, to slay David without a cause?

... And it came to pass on the <u>morrow</u>, which was the <u>second</u> day of the <u>month</u>, that David's place was <u>empty</u>: and Saul said unto Jonathan his son, Wherefore cometh not the son of <u>Jesse</u> to <u>meat</u>, neither yesterday, nor to day?

And Jonathan answered Saul, David earnestly asked leave of me to go to Bethlehem: And he said, Let me go, I pray thee; for our family hath a sacrifice in the city; and my <u>brother</u>, he hath commanded me to be there: and now, if I have <u>found</u> favour in thine eyes, let me get away, I pray thee, and see my brethren. Therefore he cometh not unto the king's table.

Then Saul's anger was <u>kindled</u> against Jonathan, and he said unto him, Thou son of the <u>perverse</u> rebellious woman, do not I know that thou hast chosen the son of Jesse to thine own <u>confusion</u>, and unto the confusion of thy mother's nakedness? For as long as the son of Jesse liveth upon the ground, thou shalt not be established, nor thy kingdom. Wherefore now send and <u>fetch</u> him unto me, for he shall surely die.

And Jonathan answered Saul his <u>father</u>, and said unto him, Wherefore shall he be slain? what hath he done? And Saul cast a <u>javelin</u> at him to smite him: whereby Jonathan knew that it was determined of his father to slay David So Jonathan arose from the table in <u>fierce</u> anger, and did eat no meat the second day of the month: for he was grieved for David, because his father had done him shame. And it came to pass in the morning, that Jonathan went out into the field at the time appointed with David
